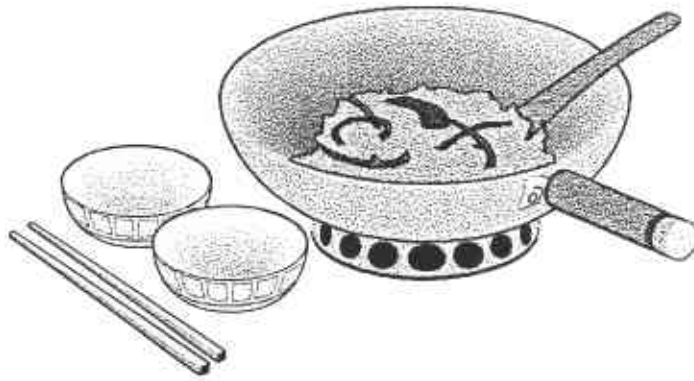

When the case came before the court this was the man's reply when asked why he acted in such a manner:

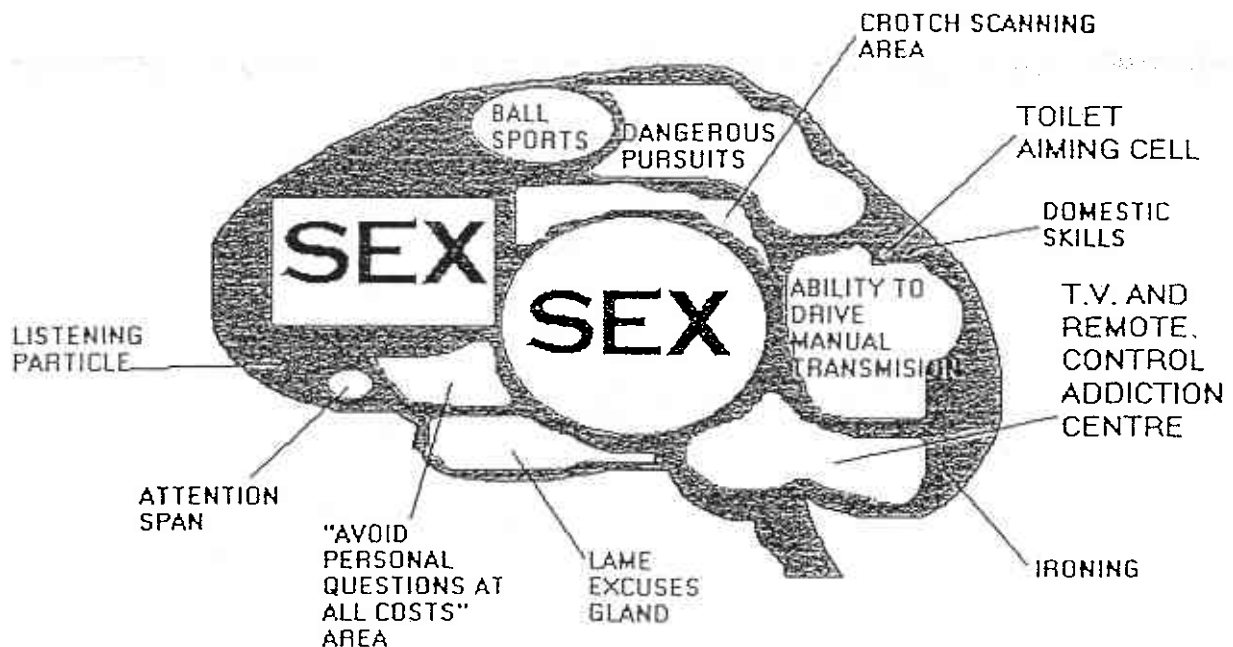
