Around the Club

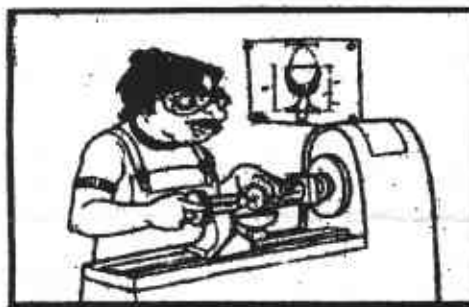
David Howell is not in the best of health at the moment, we wish David a speedy recovery and look forward to see him around the club again soon.
