It was also a financial success due to the hard work everyone did as we raised over \$2,400 on the Rocking Horse raffle and over \$2,000 on Kids Corner. With other incidental receipts we totalled \$4,621.70 before expenses are taken into account. Well done everyone. This kind of result helps to keep your fees down and enable us to fund improvements in equipment and facilities in the Club.

530 kits were sold in the 2 days. For your interest, the statistics for the main toys, out of the total of 10 kits available, were:

- 42 trays
- 41 buses
- 73 trinket boxes
- 98 pencil cases
- 74 cars
- 57 helicopters
- 23 planes

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Paul Aminde and Nancy Stephens did a great job selling kids kits. They were so good they sold me 3 kits for my grandchildren as soon as I took the photo!!

An important factor in keeping the "troops" happy and content is ensuring they are well fed so our secretary, Ian Stanfield, did the usual cooking duty he enjoys by preparing delicious quantities of eggs and sausages etc.

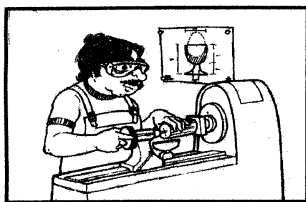
Jim Jones and Cliff Walsh are recovering.
