The increase in power supply and the installation of a ducted exhaust extraction system is the major construction work underway this month. Resiting and regrouping the existing equipment may be needed to minimize piping and allow for future additions to the ducting system etc.

Eventually we will also have extraction filter units near the roof to remove the very fine airborne dust.

Consideration is also in progress to have manual extractor outlets to allow you to gather up dust around the machines, that has escaped the new systems.

These are a major



improvements to the Club for the health and cleanliness benefits of all members. This Club facility will equal anything other clubs have and we can all be proud of our facilities.

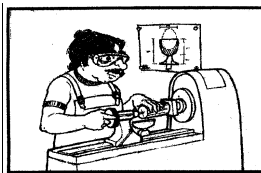

Equipment status in the Club

At the June meeting, Peter Sleeman raised the issue of **some** members not treating the workshop equipment as you would in your own workshop at home. **Some** members:

- 1) Leave equipment running when they move away to do other work. This not only wastes electricity but is dangerous as others may not hear it operating and approach the machine as if it is stationary and safe.
- 2) Do not remember to turn off dust extractors after they have finished with the machine attached to it, again wasting power and creating unnecessary noise.
- 3) Do not always cleanup after they have finished using a machine. The fact others will use it after you is not the point, as it is etiquette to cleanup after you.
- 4) Not locking machines after they have finished. If others want to use it, they are to get the key from

the Key Holder so he knows who is responsible for the operation of the machine at any time.

- 5) Someone has used the kitchen bench as a work table and glue-assembled work on it leaving glue residue that cannot be removed!
- 6) Items left in the office are there for a reason – do not take them without asking.

We do not want to plaster the workshop with ‘Do not ..’ or ‘Remember to’ Signs, so please just use common sense and observe curtesy and etiquette when in the workshop. Your Committee

What's happening to the pigeon holes?
