## OUR PRESIDENT'S 2004 ANNUAL REPORT

We started the year on a bit of a downer with no Stringybark Festival which is one of our two major fund raising activities. But we made decisions to keep solvent, by tightening the purse strings, still holding our rocking horse raffle and getting involved in various smaller fund raising activities.

In November we donated 600 toys to the Lord Mayors Appeal and St Vincent De Paul for disadvantaged kids at Christmas. We also donated a rocking horse to William Angliss Hospital.

Our Christmas Breakup on December 6<sup>th</sup> followed by Carols by Candlelight was a great success with 120 members' families and friends enjoying themselves.

We had a busy and successful time with the Knox Festival in March 2004, which is our second major fund raiser. It was very encouraging to have the assistance of 29 members on Saturday and 27 on Sunday. Thank you all and well done.

Around March we experienced electricity problems which were restricting our forward planning for equipment requirements. Our major concern in the machine shop was the safety aspect of dust extraction and space around equipment. We resolved this by installing a large 7.5 hp 4 Bag Dust Extractor in the new sanding shed behind the machine shop which gives us a cleaner, more spacious and safer working area.

Our community involvement is still very strong by assisting at Amaroo and Tullymore Homes, Scout and Guide Groups, Aids for Cerebal Palsy children, Possum boxes for needy pensioners and our Annual Toy Appeal for disadvantaged children. The Annual 'Be In It' Competition and Open Day still generates a great deal of interest for members families and friends. We had a record number of entries and attendance in August. Thanks to our Judges Cr Karin Orpen and Owen Burton who both remarked on the number, variety and quality standard of entries.

The last 12 months seem to have flown past and as the old saying goes "Time flies when you are having fun." I hope that your time spent at the club has been as much fun as mine. The major reason why I can enjoy my time is because of the hard working and dedicated teams and groups that support me in running the club. I wish to thank all of these people i.e. the Committee, Kids Corner Kits Team, Maintenance Team, Monthly Raffle Team, Rocking Horse Group, Woodturners Group, Carvers Group, Amaroo Team and Tullymore Team. All of these teams and groups have made a very busy year easier to administer the club commitments. Each and every one of these members gives 110% commitment to our club. #### **Community Projects**


