
Have you been into the turning room lately? The overhead ductwork for the exhaust system is gradually being installed and when completed will make a major

cutting out a "Scandinavian roadworker" shape from a piece of camphor wood to then finish off with hand carving. He has got the "carving bug" as I saw him a few days earlier beginning to carve a very stylish penguin shape he

had seen in a carving book. Jim Lobley is demonstrating his skill at what we called a "stippling" effect on the background of a carving while Willy Schlaf and Manfred Shores looked on. They had a lively discussion on the best way to do it and with what tools. Nobody knew the correct name for the stippling or dappling effect they were producing. It certainly allows carvers to relatively quickly fill in background sections with a



neutral pattern. Brian Douds is helped by Paddy Mc Cann to reinforce the holding of these very hard messmate timber pieces while drilling to produce several candle holders.
