

# Our President's June report

It is hard to believe that another month has gone and we are now into the month of June, but the good news is that over the last two weeks we have finally received our planning permit and building permit from KCC for our clubroom extensions. Believe it or not the Sub Committee first started talking with Council almost two years ago in July 2005, and I thank Hughie Gaynor, Frank O'Connor and Max Holt for their input over this period.

Our commitment still continues with the seeking of funds to carry out our planned extension. We have already made applications to the KCC Recreation Minor Capital Works Grant for \$10,000. We are also working with Melbourne East Area Consultative Committee (MEACC) a government body set up to assist community groups like ours to apply for Federal Government grants. Through them we are planning to make applications for a Regional Partnership Grant from the Federal Government. Another grant we will apply for is from the Community Development Fund through KCC. These applications take a lot of time and effort and I would like to thank everyone involved with putting our applications together, especially Hughie Gaynor for his support with the enormous amount of paperwork required.

Our thanks to Jason Wood MP for his help with our Equipment Grant of \$3,000.80 from the Federal Government. We received the cheque last week and have placed our order for the Spindle Moulder which should be delivered in the next week. Once we have installed it, we would like to invite Jason along to the club to thank him personally.

I would like to remind you again about our Annual "Be In It" Competition and Open Day which will be held on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> August, 2007. This leaves you only two months to complete your entries for this important day. So I ask every member to enter into the spirit of the day and get your entries in, bring along your families and friends to make this Club Showcase Day a success. Further details will be available closer to the day.

I remind you also that we are seeking volunteers for 4 Kids Korner Workshops coming up during the July school holidays. Please put your names on the appropriate list on the whiteboard at the club. Your help is really needed and appreciated.

Our toy count now stands at 15 a long way from 400 or 600. So if you have your toy finished part way through or have not started yet, I urge you to think of the Disadvantaged Kids at Christmas and support our appeal. You have only 5 months to complete your donations.

I look forward to meeting and speaking with you around the club. Paddy Mc Cann
