

Our President, Paddy Mc Cann's, June report

We have patiently waited since 1st August 2007 for an answer to our Grant Application for \$65,700 to the Federal Government Regional Partnerships Program.

On the 12th May 2008 we finally emailed the Hon. Gary Gray AO., M P., Parliamentary Secretary for Regional Development and Northern Australia with a copy to The Hon. Anthony Albanese MP., Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government.

On the 15th May we received a statement from Anthony Albanese's Office informing us that our application had been unsuccessful, because of the 2008 Budget changes to the Regional Partnerships Program, as follows --- "The Rudd Labour Government's New Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program and Better Regions Election Commitments will replace Sustainable Regions and the Regional Programs".

"The Government will honour all existing contracts under Regional Partnerships and Sustainable Regions Programs; however uncontracted applications will not be proceeded with."

"A New Regional and Community Infrastructure Program will supplement these programs from the May 2009 Budget and fund major investments in Regional Communities." In light of these changes, it means that if we wanted to apply again we would not be able to apply until after the May 2009 Budget provided they have sorted out their new protocol for such applications.

We as a Committee feel that we cannot wait that long and perhaps be disappointed again. So we are taking steps to search all other avenues for where we can make applications right away for other grants. We need to update the costing for our planned extensions then estimate how far we could get with our Building Fund. Previously we could not move because the grant we had applied for was not reciprocal. So our new application could be made for the part of the project left after going as far as we could with our Building Fund. We will keep you informed as we progress with our discussions and with any decisions we make.

If you wish to voice your displeasure and disappointment at the Rudd Labour Government's decision on turning down our Grant Application, you should ring 1800 038 160 Hotline and register your displeasure to The Minister Anthony Albanese MP. The more members and friends who register their objections the more chance we will get some reaction from the Minister.

Sorry for the bad news but it has been outside our control, if you wish to discuss this further I look forward to seeing and speaking with you around the Club.

Is it True??

The three Goldberg brothers, Norman, Hiram, and Maxwell invented and developed the first automobile air-conditioner.
