A fourth Key Holder is needed to enable us to open every Saturday, so we are calling for a volunteer or two to take on this role.



The thicknesser was out of action during December, due to a damaged drive belt. Depth of cut MUST NOT EXCEED 5 mm, based on the MAXIMUM THICKNESS of the timber. Tapered boards should be fed thick end first

to avoid jamming the feed rollers. Also, **USE THE METAL DETECTOR!**
