

President's Report - Hurtle Lupton

A very sincere thank you to those members who took the time to turn up to the working bee in March. Over twenty members gave a couple of hours on the Saturday, and all the outstanding jobs were completed, including designing a drop box for the table saw and repairs to the thicknesser. A good job well done!

Again the thicknesser has been abused. This time some timber with a screw in it was run through the machine, causing damage to both the cutters and also the bed, and resulting in the bed having to have the offending groove removed. This is the second time within five weeks that this expensive equipment has been permanently damaged as a direct result of pure carelessness by an irresponsible member.

Unfortunately, because of the continued ongoing abuse of this equipment, your Committee has reluctantly made the following decision. The key to open the thicknesser is to be removed from the key cabinet, thereby ensuring that in future any person wanting to use the thicknesser will have to approach the Key Holder who will then ensure, prior to the timber being put through the machine, that the timber has been checked with the metal detector. Once that timber has been run through the thicknesser it will again be locked until the next person wishing to use the machine requests the Key Holder to open the machine, and so on.

It must be remembered that the Key Holder is not expected to drop whatever he or she is doing to enable the thicknesser to be used. It will be at the Key Holder's discretion and convenience as to when the thicknesser is to be used.

Your Committee has been forced to take this drastic action because of the ongoing misuse of the thicknesser.

Peter Horsburgh has kindly offered to manage and co-ordinate the "Be in It ' competition for this year.

Fred Sutton has advised us that he will be moving away in late May and will be resigning as a Committee Member and also as the Key Holder for Thursday mornings. If anyone is prepared to accept the responsibility of being a Committee member would they please contact a Committee Member?

As Club Members, we are all very appreciative of Fred's willingness over recent times to volunteer for both the Committee and as a Key Holder. Thank you Fred for a job well done! I wish you good health and happiness in the future.

New Router. A new Triton 2000 watt router has been installed in the table in the corner adjacent to the Spider saw. The collets on this unit differ from those on the other Triton routers and require the whole collet assembly to be interchanged when changing between 1/4'' and 1/2'' bits. The alternative collet is located in the key cabinet. Please make sure that you place the unused collect in the key cabinet to avoid its being lost.

A replacement **Dust Extraction** system is still being investigated by the Committee, with no final decision having yet been made. This will be a major investment for the Club and needs to be thoroughly assessed.

The **"Be In It" Competition** is scheduled for Sunday 14th August. The event was not held last year due to a lack of volunteers to assist in the organisational side. Peter Horsburg has volunteered to organise the competition this year, but he will need help. From the Soapbox

The Thicknesser! In his report, our President has outlined the revised procedures for accessing the thicknesser. Conversations with other Clubs reveal that in some instances operation of the thicknesser is limited to one person, with other members having to wait until this individual can find the time to run their job. We do not want to get to this stage, so please observe the following basic procedures. **1. Use the metal detector!** The metal detector can be found on the wall abutting the turning room, and a plastic bench is situated outside the machine room door to facilitate the detector's use.



2. Ensure that the dust extraction system is

turned on! The blast has gate been removed from the thicknesser, but we have since had an instance of someone using the machine with the extraction system turned off. This will jam the rollers table and probably ruin your project.



3. Ensure that the timber is free of dirt, stones, etc. If necessary brush or sand to remove contamination prior to putting timber through the thicknesser.

4. DO NOT put painted timber trough the thicknesser.

5 Measure the thickest part of the wood and set the table accordingly for the first pass. If the wood is tapered, feed the thicker end in first.
