The Club would like to acknowledge the generosity of one of our Members who has made an **anonymous donation** of a brand-new Carba-Tec 12" cabinet saw. The new saw will be installed in the main machine room, and its use will be controlled in the same manner as the thicknesser, that is, Members will need to approach the Keyholder to unlock the machine. Whoever the Good samaritan is, thank you for this fabulous donation.

As mentioned in Hurtle's Report, a revised layout for the existing machinery room and the new bay, has been settled on. This will involve the relocation of the sanding machinery, the two router tables, the spindle moulder, the two drop-saws and the jointer, to the new bay. The new cabinet-saw and the overhead router will

occupy the main machinery room.

A **Special Working Bee** is being held on Saturday, December 17th, to relocate all of these machines in preparation for the installation of the Micronair VC8 Dust Collector and its attendant ducting, beginning December 19th.



The machine that the Club is purchasing is similar to the one at left, but will have twin 240 litre wheelie-bins. Filter-cleaning is automatic.

The tree section opens like a book and shows 9 individual internal scenes.

This is a request to Members purchasing wood from the Club, to consult with the Keyholder to determine a fair price.

At present, with major outlays looming for construction of the wall in the new bay, the dust extractor and essential electrical work, purchases are being, limited to urgent and maintenance items ONLY.



The above photo is of one of the bandsaw blades about a week after being installed. The twist in the blade is a result of attempting curved cuts of a radius too small for the width of the blade. At the moment, we seem to be averaging a life-expectancy of two weeks with the three smaller bandsaws, at a cost of \$20 to \$30 per blade. The chart below gives the minimum cutting radius for common blade sizes.

Blade width = 1/8", minimum radius = 3/16". Blade width = 3/16", minimum radius = 5/16". Blade width =1/4", minimum radius = 5/8". Blade width = 3/8", minimum radius = $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ". Blade width =1/2", minimum radius = 2 ½". Blade width = $\frac{3}{4}$ ", minimum radius = 5 1/2". Blade width = 1", minimum radius =
