

President's Report – Hurtle Lupton

By now most members will be aware of the terrible house fire totally destroying Bruce Allen's home. Bruce & his wife were left with only the clothes they were standing in. A notice was put up in the clubrooms advising members of this tragedy and very soon offers of assistance came flooding in. These included offers of furniture, electrical goods, kitchen utensils etc. I was particularly touched with the generous donations of money which came from the members', over \$1,000 to which the club has also put in \$1,000. It was great to see the manner in which the club members rallied behind Bruce and his wife when they really needed assistance. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this very worthwhile cause.

At the time of writing this report the club is closed for a new ceiling to be installed in the clubrooms, as well as air conditioning. This work is being carried out in an endeavour to make the rooms more comfortable for our older members when the weather is both cold & hot. In the ceiling there has been prepared a fireproof area which will be used to store the toys the members make during the year.

The fire proof area is **NOT** for storing other items that members believe may be useful in 5 years time.

Hughie Gaynor is to be thanked for once again taking control of these works so that they can be carried out as quickly as possible with as little disruption to the members as possible.

Eric Butterfield and Ray Norton have this year's "*Be in it*" competition which will be held on Sunday 25th August. It is hoped that every club member will enter at least one item that they have made over the last 12 months. This will show the general public just what a great club we are and the type of skills our members have!

Entries for the "*Be in it*" will be accepted at the clubrooms on Friday between 6.30pm and 9.00pm, Saturday between 9am and 12 noon and Sunday morning between 9am and 11am.

It will be necessary to hold a special working bee with a few willing workers on Saturday 24th August to assist Eric & Ray in setting up for the "*Be in it*" competition.

This year your club will celebrate the 25th Anniversary since it was founded by those people who had the foresight to recognise that there was a need for such a club. The anniversary celebrations will be held on Sunday 13th October between 2pm and 4pm. Invitations for this event will be sent out nearer the day.

Please put these dates in your diary as it is one of the very important dates on the club's calendar.

On Friday 2nd August Knox Council will be cleaning up the site particularly the old sheds along the Glenfern Road fence. It would very much appreciated if some club members could be in attendance to assist the council blokes as we have a substantial amount of chipboard which is water damaged and now totally useless.

There are also a number of large timber slabs which should be saved and will need to be stored in our area.

Bendigo Bank Project completed

Seeing the layout of what they wanted, Eric knew he had to approach a club member with the skills and attention to detail this project would require. Colin Stewart's name immediately came to mind. Initially seeking 60 brochures to be displayed, when a full scale layout was produced, Eric realized it was huge. Mick Spruhan, Bank manager, visited the club, agreed, and decided on reducing the amount of brochures to 32. Following many attempts to produce the "cups" they finally developed a method to reproduce them all the same size. They are mounted by drilling nail holes at either end gluing them into place. They also had to source the stainless steel wire and have it bent to size. Cliff Urbane from Fine Furniture Finishing gave it the professional finish it required. Eric, Colin with Hughie, delivered it on Tuesday 9th July. Mike and his staff were extremely pleased with the result.

Workshop Notes - "members helping members"

Finish for Boxes (By Phil Spencer)

When I showed some boxes at a club meeting last year several people asked what I finished them, I am partial to a satin finish on boxes. Here is how I go about it.

After sanding the box smooth using 400 grit paper I lay on a coat of **boiled linseed oil** (BLO) I let this soak in for about 20 minutes then wipe off any excess and let it dry over night, I repeat this process four to five times. After the coats of BLO have dried I then wax the box using a traditional wax (your favourite wax will do) I apply two to three coats of wax, I then finish off with a coat of paste wax.

This leave my boxes with a soft satin feel and the BLO brings out the colour and grain in the wood. I use BLO over other types of linseed oil because it will dry where as other types will stay oily and not dry completely.**Phil**
