Workshop Notes - "members helping members"

<u>Using a Scratch Stock</u> (By Phil Spencer)
When I showed some boxes at a club meeting last year
several people asked what I finished them, I am partial to a
satin finish on boxes. Here is how I go about it.

When I made my clock recently I indulged in some dark side methods, I used a scratch stock to make the reeding in the door styles and also on the underside of the moulding that runs around the clock.

Looking at Wikipedia a scratch stock is described:

A **scratch stock** is a woodworking tool used for applying decorative treatments, such as beads to furniture and other wooden items.

Scratch stocks consist of a handle, either wood or metal, with provision to clamp a steel blade into which the profile of the shape to be cut has been



filed^[1]. Scratch stocks work best in wood which has a dense grain. They work by using a scraping action which gradually cuts away fibres from the wood. The scratch stock is

drawn along the wood repeatedly until the desired shape is formed. Scratch stocks may be used to apply edge treatments and may also be used to apply decorative elements to the face of board.

I used a commercially made scratch stock, mine is made by Veritas. Using the scratch stock I was able to produce a tight profile, and reeding that I could not, using a router. A side benefit was the set up was easier and there was no noise. I was able to listen to the cricket on the radio whilst I cut the profiles I wanted. Scratch stocks can also be made in your workshop. They are simple to make from scraps that you have laying around.
