A Century of Progress. The Century in question is the occassion concerning the elevation of our Membership to that magic figure and the person involved is fittingly also a first for the Club, that is a former resident of the U.S.A.

Earl Webb, was born and educated in Nebraska City, Nebraska. He joined the U.S. Marine Reserve in 1952, successfully completed Flight Training and designated Marine Aviator in May, 1953. He was then involved in the conflict in Korea, flying jets from June 1953 to October 1953 followed by a period of service in Japan until 1954. During the years 1962 to 1972 he served almost four of those years in Vietnam. Returning to this combat zone in 1976, elevated to the rank of Major and assuming command of a Navy helicopter, he flew 2,722 missions, being wounded on a number of occassions and awarded numerous decorations, chiefly the Distinguished Service Medal, Distinguished Flying Cross (twice) and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry.

Despite this long period of combat service he was able, under a GI Bill at Government expense, to complete his College Education, graduating in 1972 at the University of Nebraska, with a Bachelors Degree in Industrial Arts and Graduate Studies in Education Administration

Married to an Australian Nursing Sister, Lynette, for the 27 years, he is the proud father of 5 offspring and has resided in Australia for the past 16 years. Asked to express his philosophy on life, he observed that "it is not how many times you fall down that is important, but the ability to get up and press on", a sentiment with which we would all endorse and I am sure that Earl will become a familiar and welcome addition to our ranks.
