The club has recently purchased a Delta router shaper to replace the triton router bench set up. The ½ router is now in the power tool rack. When you have a chance,



## **Timbers (from Forestry Tasmania)**

#### **HUON PINE**

Huon Pine is among the earliest trees to evolve. The first pollen records date back 135 million years.

It reaches the great age: trees over 2000 years have been dated, placing the species among the longest lived organisms on earth. Some specimens still growing, could be over 5000 years old.



Distribution is restricted to the west & south west of Tasmania where it occurs along riverbanks and in other wet patches. It grows to 20 or 30 metres high and some trees reach 40 metres. Huon pine has remained a most prized rain forest timber. The timber itself is a mellow, fine textured wood with a characteristic,

pleasant fragrance. It seasons readily, has a low shrinkage rate, is soft and easily worked; is a light weight and has good nail holding properties.

This, together with its stability and high resistance to attack by

rot and marine organisms, have earned Huon pine a high regard as a ship building material.

It is highly prized for furniture making, joinery, turning and in the craftwood industry.

The durability of the wood is due to the presence of an essential oil, which gives Huon pine its unique odour.
