

A Message From The Judge

I was fortunate to be asked to help judge the done by the members of the Knox Woodworkers on Sunday 4th August. As I have visited the clubrooms and the workshops previously, I was aware of the great range of equipment available, and imagined that the 150 members would make good use of the opportunity to create worthwhile projects. I was not disappointed. A great variety was set out for the two judges, and the level of dedication left me in great awe. I was offered the opportunity to speak to the participants on the day but I declined as I thought the written word might



be more appropriate than the spoken. Besides there was still plenty of the excellent cakes and sandwiches provided by the members and their wives. Why stand there listening when you could be eating?

I think some members may benefit from having a checklist available when their projects are nearing completion. It is all too easy to be absorbed in the practicalities of the construction that the necessities of finishing are overlooked. Sometimes some one else appraising your work can help lift the standard.

To assist you to improve your projects, I have some questions.

Do you:

- use more than two coats of polyurethane?
- use abrasive paper between each coat?
- rub candle wax on the draw runners?
- ensure the finish inside and beneath your project is equal to the top?
- make sure your toy passes the "touch test"?
- use abrasive paper with the grain to remove those circular scratches?
- remove all paint/varnish runs?

The dedication and enthusiasm and enthusiasm of the club members have created an atmosphere that is quite inspiring. May all your projects be winners? Cliff Walsh

How To Use Rustin's DANISH OIL on WOODTURNINGS

5 Easy Steps to produce an excellent finish!

Finish sanding your woodturning with 320grit or finer,

on some woods you can improve the final finish by sanding up to 500grit.

Then to your finely sanded surface with the Lathe stopped.....

How Long Does it Take to Make One of Those?

Do you mean... not plant the tree, but find the wood, just 'see' the piece, (as if I could)? to find a highly figured burl, a crotch, an eye, or pearly curl? And once I spy it, perhaps buy it, inventory, store, and dry it? Then saw or cut it, possibly I kiln it' glue, imbue with fill, or drill it? You mean, that once I'm satisfied it's stopped the warps, checks, cracks, once dried? And mounted on the lathe, to turn it, (which takes much practice, just to learn it; and then employ a gouge, or two, or use a skew, which I don't eschew, to mold it, shape it (what's your pleasure?) by all means, I'm sure to measure, then sand it smooth, please wear your mitts, from coarse to fine, 10,000 grits, then braze, or burnish, paint, or polish, (the goal: enhance, and don't demolish)? Is that your question, start to end, how long's that path, its way to wend? Or do you merely want to know how long it turned? Ten minutes, or so.

Homemade Centre-Finder For Wood Turners

Purchase a 12" square piece of 1/8" to 1/4" thick clear Plexiglass or Lexan at your hardware store or home centre. Leave the protective paper on the plastic and drill a small, 1/32" hole through the plastic at your centre point. Using a sharp, pointed set of steel dividers, carefully scratch a series of circles through the protective paper and into the plastic below, being careful not to "snag" the paper, creating a rough edge.

Once all your circles are scribed, spray a dark-colours enamel over the protective paper and allow it to dry thoroughly. Remove the paper and position your centrefinder over the end of your dowel or cylinder and use the scribed lines to help you find the exact centre


