Stephen Hanau is busy nailing some shadow boxes. Brian Douds, a new member, is marking out a fascia surround for the microwave in his caravan.



The Wood Store

If you have been around the club recently, you will have noticed a fair amount of activity in our new wood store. Currently we are sorting out timber and getting ready to move the racks into their new position.

It is planned to have two racks, one against the wall and a five-foot rack in the middle. The middle rack will have dividers in it to allow for more efficient storage. We will also have a sorting table at the front of the shed so we are not storing unsuitable material.

We are also looking to improve the sheds near the front fence to make better use of them, particularly in storing large sheets etc.

Thanks to those who have brought in timber, it is always a great help. Until the storage facilities are complete the committee asks that no more timber be brought into the club.

When the store is complete and if you intend to bring timber please contact a committee member to organize its storage.

Equipment Status in the Club

Thicknesser

Unfortunately replacement parts are not available (or even a price for the parts!) from the agent at this time so the timing for recommissioning is difficult to predict. The committee is evaluating the cost and effectiveness of getting a local fix of the existing plate.

Scroll Saw

The committee is investigating the purchase of a new saw and will question what will suit our needs before purchasing.

Table saw

The existing saw tends to stall when large sections of hardwood are forced through the machine. Please let the saw cut at its own rate under these circumstances as the blade is sharp but the motor is obviously working at its maximum and stalls when forced.

Router table

A new table is being considered by the committee.

Existing equipment

There was a lively and healthy debate and many constructive suggestions at the last general meeting on how we might reduce equipment damage, following Peter Sleeman's justified frustration at the ongoing excessive incidents of equipment damage. The 2nd belt sander now needs replacing while screws were found loose on the air compressor.
