

Turner's Talk




February has been quite a busy month with the woodturners at the club, not a lot of turning, but a lot of work on our new turning room. With our lathes now working, it is time to get down to some serious

Equipment Status in the Club

Thicknesser

The repairs are underway but please don't touch the unassembled parts as they have been placed in the correct order ready for final reassembly. Hopefully the machine will be operational again by mid March.

Docking saw

The blade has had to be replaced at a cost around \$150 and much of Peter Sleeman's time. No wonder Peter (and the whole committee and members) are getting annoyed with misuse of equipment. Peter found a wood offcut in the bin with a sizeable nail cut through by the saw. However, to get the offcut Peter saw the person had to cut through the nail **twice!** This was no only highly dangerous to the person cutting but to anyone around them at the time!

New equipment

A subcommittee will be formed this year to review the replacement and new equipment needs of the club over the next few years. This will ensure the needs are prioritised and the money required is responsibly budgeted each year.

Dust extraction

The committee is aware that we need to consider ways to further minimise dust in the workshop to protect your health. It will also keep the workshop looking cleaner. The aim is to do it properly, which will involve considerable expense, so it will take time to investigate the most appropriate installation and then allocate the funds for it over the next year or so.

THE DOCKING SAW

Due to the recent unsafe incident that necessitated replacement of the saw blade, as Peter highlighted in his report, all second hand timber is to be checked with the metal detector for metal objects (nails, bolts, screws, staples etc) before cutting.

This rule already applies to timber to be put through the thicknesser.


Some have questioned whether this check should apply to new as well as second hand timber. While this rule will not apply at this time, examples of protest groups inserting metal into growing trees was cited. Also a member raised the true story from years ago of a new log being milled and a complete rabbit trap being found inside it! Obviously many years before, someone had hung a rabbit trap in the young tree and the tree had grown around the trap!

fact, the carving is a repeat of one he has already done!

Gerry was working on a fine detail floral relief in Camphor wood that was giving him problems as the soft wood and variable grain texture did not lend to easy fine detailed carving. By the time he redesigns and re-carves the pattern to correct for these problems every time a piece falls out, he may end up with almost no flowers and leaves and just a couple of plant stalks!
