

OUR VICE PRESIDENT'S MAY REPORT

On the evening of our last meeting 7th May, our Club President Peter Sleeman underwent an operation on his knee, where part of the cartilage was removed. He returned home to convalesce, and this was going well for about ten days. He then experienced a severe pain in the calf of his leg and returned to the hospital and was diagnosed with deep vein thrombosis, and had a further overnight stay in hospital. He is now home again, with a nurse calling daily, to monitor his blood and administer daily injections to counteract the blood clotting. Peter is still very ill and we will not see him about the club for some time. Peter, our sincere wishes and prayers go to you for a speedy recovery.

Our regards and wishes for a speedy recovery go also to Paul Aminde who was in hospital at the same time as Peter. Paul unfortunately also had a setback in his recovery.

On Monday 12th May, we unofficially received some bad news, that this years Stringybark Festival had been cancelled because of major building works at Rowville Community Centre. As this is the site of the festival, the site is considered too dangerous. We have since contacted Ian Bell the festival organiser at Knox Council, confirming the cancellation and we are expecting an official letter from Council. This is very bad news for the club, because our involvement at the Stringybark Festival raises more than 30% of our annual income from the sale of raffle tickets for our Rocking Horse and our Kids Corner Stall. It will mean that we as a club will have to look more closely at our expenditure for the next 12 months and cut corners where necessary.

On a lighter note, Sunday 25th May saw another successful Woodturning Demonstration by Guilio Marcolonga. 22 people attended including visitors from Waverley and Philip Island Clubs. Everyone enjoyed the day and this was evident by the audience silence and concentration during

Guilio's demonstration. Our thanks go to Guilio for his dedication and demonstration. Thanks also to Bob Plant and the wood turners for organising the Day.

Before closing, I would like to remind all members about our "Be In It" Competition to be held on Sunday 10th August. I have noticed a number of projects that members are preparing for the competition. There is not much time left as we are already into June. I encourage you all to enter our Annual Competition and for you and your family and friends to attend on the day. It is an opportunity to show the quality, diversity and skill of club members. Looking forward to meeting you around the club.
