

#### Ever wondered where your fees etc go?

Every month at the general meeting Doug Dell gives the monthly treasurers report and expenditures, however, not even I appreciated the considerable costs we incur over time. The annual cost of operating the Club is escalating at an alarming rate that has been buffered by successful Knox and Stringybark Festivals and Rocking Horse raffles etc.

To give you an idea of the costs, just ponder on the following:

When you total these two expenditures each year and take a nominal approximate membership of 150 members per year, this means the money spent on behalf of each member

has been: 1999-2000 \$76 2000-2001 \$113 2001-2002 \$119 To May 2003 \$76 to date

Just one new major project we want, and need, to spend money on is upgrading the dust extraction at some time in the future.

Your annual membership fee of \$40 entitles you to utilise the Club workshop during any of the 36 hours each week the facilities are open. We do not know of any other woodwork group that is open for so many hours. This works out at just over \$1 per hour. If you have a cup of coffee during a break you have virtually covered your cost!!

### **Community Services by the Club**

The Club continues to provide a small number of individuals from the community, who attend with a carer, to



have a chance at woodworking. The members who assist in this are to be commended.
