OUR PRESIDENT'S FEBRUARY REPORT

As we start 2004 I would like to take this opportunity to wish all members and their families a Safe, Healthy, and Prosperous New Year.

We finished 2003 with another successful and enjoyable Christmas Break-up Function, followed by Carols by Candlelight on Saturday 6th December. We had 120 members, family and friends thanks to the social club committee, Doug Dell, Bill Longden, Peter Horsburgh, Ian Stanfield and myself. Thank You Gentlemen, for a job well done.

On Thursday 22nd January we had two sessions of "Kid's Corner" at 11.00am and 1.00pm for the Knox Library and Community Centre, School Holiday Program with 30 children at each session. My thanks go to Joyce Brown, Peter Horsburgh, Bill Longden and Paul Phillips who assisted the children with making the kits on the day and raising \$370. Thank you all - well done!

We start the year with 134 financial members, which is very healthy, but the problem we face is that when we have an activity where we require volunteers to help, it is always the same dedicated few people who turn up on the day. So this year we want to see a big increase in the number of volunteers coming forward for Working Bees, Festivals, selling raffle tickets outside Bunnings and any other club activities and fund raisings where help is needed. Our annual fees of \$50 are lower than most other woodworking clubs and equates to approximately \$1 per week. The major reason for us being able to keep our fees so low is because of our involvement in our fund raising activities. Two such activities where we require volunteers are:

(1) our first Working Bee on 2004 on Sat 14th Feb from 8.00am till 12.00pm

(2) The Knox Festival on Saturday 20th and Sunday 21st March, as this is one of our major fund-raising activities. So think seriously about your commitment to your club and nominate for these activities.

Australian Standards to apply for the toys we make

The Committee is in the process of obtaining a copy of the Australian Standards that apply for all children's toys sold or donated in Australia.

It is important that you recognise the need for meeting these Standards in future when designing and constructing toys. Fortunately, most of the toys our members traditionally make are of solid construction with no sharp edges or points or with small pieces that can easily break off and dislodge in children's throats etc.

Equipment Status in the Club

The committee has approved the investigation and purchase of an oscillating sander table principally to improve the productivity of the dedicated group making Club toy kits.


What additional equipment do you think the Club needs?
