

Gentlemen, in both Clubs, please accept our sincere thanks for all your time efforts and skills.

I would again like to remind members of our "Be In It" Competition and Open Day to be held on Sunday 13th August. This is our annual opportunity to show our Club skills and talents to other members, our families, friends and the public. The only restrictions on members entries to the competition is that they must have been made within the

last 12 months. I encourage all members and especially our newer members, to make the effort to enter into the spirit of the competition. If you have not started your entries yet you still have 4 months to complete them. We will keep you posted on the arrangements for the day.

I would remind you also of our commitment to making "Toys for Disadvantaged Children for Christmas". Our commitment being that each member would make at least one toy for the children for Christmas. Last year 2005 we donated 400 toys and the previous year 2004 we donated 600 toys. I ask you to make a concentrated effort to at least reach last years total of 400 toys. I would also like to hear from anyone who would be interested in joining a "Toy Making" Group. Please think about it, as many other woodworking clubs already have successful toy making groups.
