

- (a) We have signed our Lease Agreement and await the completed document from Council.
- (b) Our Proposed Building Extensions, we have engaged and signed an agreement with Design 20, Building Designers, to confer with Knox Planning Dept. and prepare drawings etc. to Council requirements, so that proper costs can be prepared for the project. Once we have these costs and Council agreement we can then look at available avenues to fund our extensions.

Membership Fees are due from 1<sup>st</sup> September. The Committee have decided to increase our fees from \$50 to \$55, an increase of \$5 per year, which is due to our now having to meet the cost for tea, coffee, sugar and milk. The Committee thought that this was the easiest way to cover this added expense.

I would remind you that our Annual General Meeting and Election of Officers for your Committee for 2006 / 2007 will be held at our Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October Meeting. All Committee Positions will be declared vacant and I ask all members to consider earnestly their option to contribute to the successful running of Your Club by nominating for a position on Committee.
