

May I take this opportunity to notify you that our 'Be In It' Competition and Open Day this year will be held at the Club Rooms on Sunday 17th August 2008. For those who do not know what this is all about, some years ago we established our Annual 'Be In It' 'Competition for the purpose of Members to be able to display their Skills and Craftsmanship to their peers, friends and families. Each member, new or old is asked to enter into the spirit of the day and to complete one or more articles for entry in the competition. The only restriction on entries is that your entry must have been completed within the last 12 months. We divide entries into categories for judging purposes. This day is our opportunity to display the Variety, Skills and Quality of work, because most members do not finish their projects at the Club and other members are always keen to see the finished article. It also gives other members other projects they would like to or be able to attempt. You now still have 3 months to start or complete your entry and I would encourage every member to enter the competition and support your Club in this Annual event. Further details with entry categories will be available at a later stage.

I would also encourage members to support our Toys for Disadvantaged Children Christmas Appeal. Last year we gave 400 Toys. Currently we have only 60 Toys donated, so we have quite a way to go to reach our target of at least 400. Each member is asked to donate a least one toy for the children. If you have not started yours yet, you have about 6 months to get your toys to the Club as we will present our toys at our November Meeting. We can store your finished donations at the Club.

Our planned extensions to the Club are still in limbo. To date we have had no further information on our application to the Federal Government for the Grant which we lodged with them on the 1st August 2007. Your Committee are currently discussing other alternatives to progress with our Extensions. We will keep you informed on any new developments.
