Our President, Paddy Mc Cann's, September report

I am pleased to report that our Building Extension Project has commenced. Last weekend the Site Security Fence was erected which is an Occupational Health and Safety requirement on all building sites. Thanks to Bill Orpen the site was marked out on Sat. morning 23th August ready for the concreters to prepare the site for the concrete slab to be laid about Thursday 28th August. The concrete slab will need to cure for about 4 days before the Stump Hole Digger can drive on it. From then on you will see a steady progress in the erection of our building. So by the time of my October Report I hope to be able to inform you that we will need volunteers to assist with the trimming of the interior of the building.

But with the Good News comes the Bad and again we ask your support with the Parking at the Club. We ask all members to park Outside the Gates to leave room for the builders to park inside and for access for any delivery trucks to the site. We would also ask you to be careful in not parking on the grassed area outside the fence, as the area has become very soft from the recent wet weather and we have had to help a number of members who have got bogged in the mud in the last couple of days. We suggest that you park in the parking area of the adjacent Oval where there is adequate firm parking available. If you have something heavy which you need to work on, drive to the concrete apron in front of the workshop, unload your

articles, and then take your car to the Oval car park. We thank you in anticipation of your support in this difficulty.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that your Membership Fees for 2008/2009 which have increased to \$65 are due on 1st September and if not paid by 31st October will incur a further \$10 for late payment.

Our "Be In It" Competition and Open Day held on Sun. 17th August was again a success. On the day we had about 140 members, families and friends in attendance. We had 133 entries from 37 members in 22 categories and I would like to congratulate all entrants on the quality, craftsmanship and better finish on all the entries which was noted by our judges on the day. Congratulations to all those members who were successful in the Competition and were presented with their Certificates. To all the members who were unsuccessful on the day my congratulations and thanks for entering into the spirit of the day with your entries and supporting your Club Activities. To all of you I say thank you and well done. My disappointment on the day was that only 37 members from our total membership of 175 entered into the Competition. So maybe next year you will prepare your entries and support this worthwhile Annual Club Activity.

My thanks to our judges Cr. Karin Orpen, Ted Anderson and Cliff Walsh for again giving their valuable time and expertise in judging our competition, to Peter Horsburgh for supervising and co-ordinating our Afternoon Tea so professionally, to Joyce Brown for all her support in recording all the entries and assisting John O'Rorke in
