

#### **Regular Club Group Activities**

#### <u>Thicknesser</u>

The thicknesser is out of action again, due to a nail or screw being fed through the cutting head. Accidents can happen, and if they do and a machine is damaged, then it should be reported to the Keyholder so that repairs can be instigated. The current situation appears to be the result of carelessness, and was not reported until another member discovered the damaged blades when attempting to use the machine.

#### Steps in using the thicknesser:-

- **\***Consult the Keyholder before use.
- **\***<u>Use the metal detector to check all timber!</u>
- Check timber for non-metallic contamination such as dirt and stones.
- Do not put painted or contaminated timber through the thicknesser - remove the paint at home.
- **\***Clean-up and relock the machine after use.
- Report any faults to the Keyholder.
