
President's Report - Hurtle Lupton

Your committee has instigated the purchase of a new thicknesser to replace the existing one. The new unit, which promises to provide a much more professional finish, is a Powermatic 201HH 22" with the following specifications:

- •Cutting width 558 mm
- •Cutting height 241 mm
- •Minimum length 220 mm
- Minimum thickness 6 mm
- •Feed speeds 2
- •Feed rate 20-30 feet per
- Cutter Knives Helical Cutter Head
- •Speed 4,800 rpm
- Motor 7.5 hp 3 phase
- •Solid cast iron infeed/outfeed tables

The above package will also include training in the safe use and maintenance of the thicknesser.

The helical head on this new thicknesser will result in a substantially lower noise level, and will produce much smaller chips which will hopefully reduce the problem which currently occurs, with the extractor frequently becoming blocked because of the larger chips that the current thicknesser creates.



With this new thicknesser coming on line in the near future it is imperative that all timber is scanned with the metal detectors which are readily provided by the club. If you are not sure about their location please ask the key holder for assistance.

It is becoming a very expensive budget item paying for the repairs to equipment caused by tools being used on timber which has not been scanned with the metal detectors. Only last week two extensively damaged router bits were anonymously left in the clubrooms, supposedly for the club to repair. It was obvious that both bits had been used on timber which contained metal or some other foreign matter. Please remember that painted timber is not to be put through any of the Club's equipment.

It has also been reported to the committee that somebody had improvised on the dust extraction on one of the mitre saws. This improvisation included removing the safety mesh on the saw and placing it elsewhere on the floor in the workshop, removing the extractor hose and jamming a block of timber in the saw's extractor pipe which then caused the saw to jam. It is becoming extremely difficult for the committee to ensure that all of your equipment is

working properly when these phantom, irresponsible members continue to sabotage our equipment.

I must again thank those hardworking Club members who willingly volunteer to attend other organisations who request help over the year. It is these dedicated Club members who give the Knox & District Woodworkers such an excellent name within the City of Knox and the surrounding community. Thank you all for a job well done.

impressed when they visited the Woodworking Warehouse to witness a Shelix Helical head in operation. This was followed by a trip to the Gopher Joinery in Lynbrook, where the proprietor, Jude, was kind enough to demonstrate his Powermatic 201 thicknesser in operation. As a result of the group's recommendation, an order has been placed for a Powermatic 201HH thicknesser with Shelix head.

Just a further reminder that, despite its imminent replacement, our existing thicknesser still needs to be treated with respect. IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT ALL TIMBER, INCLUDING NEW, BE SCANNED BEFORE BEING PASSED THROUGH ANY OF THE CLUB'S MACHINES! TIMBER SHOULD ALSO BE INSPECTED FOR NON-METALLIC FOREIGN MATTER SUCH AS DIRT AND STONES, AND PAINT SHOULD BE REMOVED AT HOME. FAILURE TO DO THIS NOT ONLY LEADS TO THE **UNNECESSARY** DESTRUCTION OF EXPENSIVE BLADES, BUT CAN RUIN THE WORK OF THE NEXT MEMBER TO USE THAT MACHINE!
