

Following the new procedure in controlling the use of the thicknesser, I am please to report that last month there was no significant damage to the machine. Thank you to all members who have put up with the inconvenience of having to wait on the Key Holder before the thicknesser can be used, and a very big thank you to the Key Holders who have accepted this additional responsibility in a professional manner.

The last Working Bee was again very successful, with 25 members turning up to clean up the workshops and perform general maintenance duties. It is very important that with all the machinery located in the various workshops that we continue to operate in a safe environment. Our Working Bees are a testament to this.

When Nick Wakeling, State Member for Ferntree Gully, visited the premises three weeks ago, he was advised of the club's intention to install an air filtration system in order to ensure the capture of very small dust particles which currently circulate through out the workshops. Nick was very interested and concerned with the problem, and has made a requested for funding from the Minister for Community Services.

Laura Smyth, Federal Member for Latrobe will also be visiting the clubrooms where members of the Committee will explain the dust problem and request her assistance in the possibility of obtaining funding from the Federal Government.

Thank you to all those members who were at the Clubrooms during the above visits. You certainly helped make a very good impression as to the working of the Club.

Your Committee has made a request for the club to utilise one of the bays in the former Placemakers shed. Officers from the Knox City Council visited the clubrooms were it was explained to them how the availability of additional work space would improve the safety of the Club Members. We must express our thanks to **Wanita** from **The Woodworking Warehouse**, who has kindly donated a selection of push-sticks and push-blocks to the Club. These have been distributed around the machine shop, and we encourage you all to make good use of these essential aids to safety.



Two additional lathes have been donated to the Club, a Teknatool TL-1000 and a Millers Falls WLFB-4S. It is intended to put these into service in the near future. The Woodfast 1000 has been remotored and should be back in service soon.

The date from which half the annual fee shall apply for newly joining Members is now March 1st. New Members joining the Club on or after March 1st in any year will now pay the joining fee (currently \$55.00) plus half the annual fee of (currently) \$65.00, ie. \$32.50). New Members joining prior to March 1st shall pay the full fees. A note about opening hours. Members can access the Club's facilities during any of the timetabled hours for any woodworking project. However, the group that is timetabled does have priority over the use of equipment if there is a clash.

From the Soapbox

Whilst there has been no major damage to the thicknesser this month, there has been, nevertheless, some damage to the table, caused



by something metal being dropped on it. The raised lip around the small dent would have produce scratching on the surface of any timber being passed over it if

left unrepaired. It is essential that we all take care in how we treat the cast-iron tables on all of the Club's machines, be it the jointer, tablesaw, router-table, etc., as the denting of these surfaces will result in marring the finished timber. If you must put a metal object on any of these surfaces, please do so gently!

It has come to our attention that some Members installing grinding wheels without are "ringing" them first. When changing the wheels on any bench grinder, it is essential to perform a "ring test". A damaged or cracked wheel can explode, so if you are uncertain as to how to "ring the wheel", then ask for help. All grinding wheels can break, therefore do not stand directly in front of the wheels when starting the grinder. Alan Peach will be giving a brief presentation on both this subject and the use of twist drills at this month's Meeting.
