# From the Soapbox

Our Club provides Members with the opportunity to use machinery which is often beyond the budget and resources for most of us to own, but we do expect Members to supply AND USE some basic equipment of their own. The most critical of these are **ear and eye protection**. The Club does own several full-face safety shield and a few pairs of earmuffs, but from a hygiene point of view it is preferable to use your own. A full-face mask can be purchased for under \$15, good protective glasses for about \$6 and ear-protectors from about \$6 upwards.

The need for eye protection is obvious and should not be ignored. The need for ear protection may not be so obvious. Prolonged exposure to noise levels above 85 db have the capacity to induce permanent hearing damage. It is essential for Members to use ear protection whilst operating the thichnesser, planer, circular saws and routers.


The following is an extract from the thicknesser manual, and applies to most machinery.

- Always wear approved safety glasses/face shields while using this planer. Everyday eyeglasses only have impact resistant lenses; they are not safety glasses.
- Before operating this planer, remove tie, rings, watches and other jewelry, and roll sleeves up past the elbows. Remove all loose clothing and confine long hair. Non-slip footwear or anti-skid floor strips are recommended. Do not wear gloves.
- Wear ear protectors (plugs or muffs) during extended periods of operation.

And finally, the usual reminder:-

PLEASE USE THE METAL DETECTOR and VISUALLY INSPECT all timber before passing it through ANY OF THE MACHINES!
