

Over the course of the Christmas break, and with the assistance of Alan Peach and Bent Holst-Jensen, our Club President, Hurle Lupton, resealed the Clubroom floor, no small task. The work put in by these three Members, as well as those that helped with the moving of furniture, etc., should be appreciated by all of us.



The thicknesser has been serviced, with all 150 cutters being individually cleaned and rotated. The table and rollers have been stripped back to the bare metal and recoated with Silber Glide. This service took almost nine man-hours to complete, and the machine is performing like new. I once again remind Members that the use of the metal detector is MANDATORY on all timber going through this machine. Even new timber can have staples present. Timber MUST BE VISUALLY CHECKED for foreign matter,

and especially for brass fasteners, stones, dirt and paint. Dirt must be brushed off and paint completely removed prior to passing the timber through the thicknesser. This approach should be adopted prior to using ANY CLUB MACHINE as failing to do so can not only result in costly damage, but can also pose a serious safety threat!



The **new wall** has at last been erected! The **Working Bee** to be held on Saturday, February 11th, will focus on the relocation of machinery in anticipation of the installation of the new Micronair VC8 Dust Collector and its attendant ducting over the following week. The new location for each machine is being marked on the floor, and a schedule will be drawn up to indicate the order in which each item is to be moved. Please, do try to attend this **Working Bee**, as there is a lot of equipment to move on the day.

The Club would like to express its gratitude to **iPrimus** for a donation of \$750 to fund Community projects.

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The Club would like to thank the **nine Knox Councillors** who have donated the sum \$4,600 to the Club to assist with the financing of our new dust extraction system.
