Please put these dates in your diary as it is one of the very important dates on the club's calendar.







<u>Workshop Notes</u> - "members helping members" <u>Mitre cuts on the Table Saw</u> (By Phil Spencer)

When I set my table saw blade to 45 deg so I can cut the side of a box I use a digital angle gauge, I first set the gauge on the top of the saw table and zero the instrument, I then mount the instrument on the saw blade using the magnetic base, the readout is now 90 deg and I then roll the blade over until the reading is 45 deg, I can then confidently make accurate 45 deg cuts and know that my boxes will come together with 90 deg corners.

However there is another way! start be setting the saw blade to 45 deg using a 45 - 45 - 90 setsquare using your mitre gauge set to 90 deg relevant to the tilted saw blade make a test cut on two separate pieces of stock. Place the two pieces on the flat surface of your saw table and push the two 45 deg cut ends together, if there is a gap adjust the tilt of the blade and make another two separate test cuts, carry on until you can see no light through the join when the two pieces are pushed together, when this happens the blade is exactly tilted at 45 deg and you can carry on making your box.






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Another terrific Workshop Note:

Fitting the base to a box (By Phil Spencer) When making a small box, fitting the bottom panel is an integral part of assembling the box and holding the box square. Here is how I go about it:

- After cutting my sides and <u>before</u> I cut the mitres and sides to length I cut a slot the width of my saw blade along one edge this slot is about 6-8mm in from the edge and about the 6-8mm deep the slot is 3mm wide (the width of my saw blade).
- I then cut the mitres and sides to length, I can then measure the length of the slot and determine the size if the base panel.
- I cut the panel to size using 3mm (same width of my saw blade) MDF board
- using the base panel to help hold the box together and square I can then lay out the sides apply the glue and literally "roll the box up". I use masking tape to hold the box together until the glue sets, there is no need for clamps.
