

Workshop Notes - "members helping members" Set up blocks (By Phil Spencer)

Set up blocks are an item that will not only save time in the workshop, it will also make it easier to repetitively set up your machines for standard operations. I have come across a few commercial set up block sets. These are usually made from anodised aluminium stock and although they look appealing they are expensive, and because they look so nice you might be reluctant to use them because they will scratch and in no time at all look shabby. What use is a tool if you are reluctant to use it?

I have found a cheaper way. I wander down to my local industrial transmission supplier (in my case WWW Industrial in Ferntree Gully Road) and buy a length of key steel. Key Steel comes in both metric and imperial sizes, it is accurately machined and can be cut to a size you prefer to work with, and it is cheap to buy.

When I built the tool box to hold all the tools I made in my apprenticeship, I needed to cut some slots on my spindle moulder so I could make a raised panel for the lid. A commercial set up block would have been too short to straddle the gap in the top of the spindle moulder, but a piece of key steel was just right. It allowed me to easily set my cutter height by using the key steel as a reference. See the picture below.



So before you next think of spending lots of money for an aide, consider if there is a better way or a cheaper to do what you want.Phil
