

play it at the Club using our own equipment. This equipment is mounted in it's own stand on the right hand side of the doorway leading into the Paddy McCann room and the DVD's are on the bench in the Office.

If you are not already using the wide range of services that the Bendigo Bank offer, might I respectively suggest that you consider doing so as, I assume that as individuals, you would support the Organisations that have supported the Woodies in many ways over the years.
